ELVD Beaches

It's summertime once again and the district's recreational facilities are available for all district residents. Also, pets are not allowed on any of the 3 district beaches but are allowed at the inlet beach to cool off those hot paws.

House Numbering

Finding it hard for family, friends, along with delivery and emergency services to locate your home? Maybe it's because your house isn't easily identifiable because the number address isn't attached to your home. ELVD officials are

reminding district homeowners that state law directs and is the homeowner's responsibility to ensure house numbers are attached to their homes, making it easy to locate for all concerned.



Speed Limits

Residents are reminded that the speed limit on all district roads is **15 MPH**. We live in a recreational environment in which residents enjoy daily walks often accompanied by children and pets. Also, children may come out of nowhere and become possible victims. Driving slow and defensively will anticipate the unexpected. Please obey all posted traffic signs and it's good practice to stop at every intersection to help alleviate those "near misses". The life you save may be your own.

Water Leaks

The district's water system is managed and run by the Water System Operator's (WSO) in which our commissioners are the direct liaison for any water issued that may occur. Water leaks may occur from cracks in water lines and frozen pipes during winter months. If you see a puddle that doesn't seem to go away on the roadside or even on private property, this may be a leak. Water leaks can be reported by contacting any of the commissioners. Summer residents are asked to ensure to close off all water lines leading to their residents at the end of the season. Water conservation is everyone's responsibility.
